### **General instructions to candidates**

### Admission:-

- All admitted candidates are expected to stay updated with the University news provided through the institution's website, <u>www.ideku.net</u>, University Website <u>www.keralauniversity.ac.in</u> and through newspaper sections specifically meant for Kerala Uuniversity news.
- 2. Fees should be remitted as prescribed in the prospectus and the chellan for remittance of tuition fees should be submitted in the SDE Officewithin the stipulated dates.
- 3. Students must carry their ID Cards during their visits to the institution.
- 4. Only registered candidates are permitted to contact the office for matters related to the enrolled program.
- 5. Students are advised to keep a personal file containing copies of their registration details, fee receipts (course & examination) till the completion of the course.

### **Course instructions and examination**

- 1. The medium for content delivery shall be English, except for language courses other than English, unless otherwise stated therein
- 2. The program follows semester system.
- 3. The scheme and syllabus followed distance program is one and the same as that followed for regular programmes under the University of Kerala.
- 4. Registration for courses and examinations must be done separately for each semester(6 Semesters for UG and 4 Semester for PG programs)
- 5. The examination for odd and even semesters shall be conducted together towards the end of every academic year.
- 6. Attendance in the PCP is not compulsory for the students to appear in examination (except for library science and computer science programs). However students who could not attain 50% of total attendance will need to pay a condonation fee fixed by university to appear for End SemesterUniversity examinations.
- 7. The major subjects selected at the beginning of the programme cannot be changed during the course period.

# **Project**

- 1. Project work must be completed only under guidance of a teacher assigned by the course coordinator.
- 2. Project work can be done either individually or in groups not exceeding five students. However each student must submit his/her own report of the project work.
- 3. The Project report must be submitted before the commencement of sixth semester & fourth semester examinations for UG & PG respectively.
- 4. The topic should be selected by the students in consultation with the supervising teacher.

- 5. The structure and preparation norms of the project will be advised by concerned supervising teacher.
- 6. For BA Economics there is no choice of Project, they have to write a paper as General Essay along with sixth semester examination.
- 7. The students may contact SDE office for administrative inquiries and teachers for academic support during office hours (10.00-12.30 AM and 1.30-4.30 PM).

## **Continuous evaluation(CE)**

- 1. A maximum of 20 marks to UG students and a maximum of 25 marks to PG students may be awarded as part of Continuous Evaluation. This includes marks obtained for assignments, test papers and practical.
- 2. A separate minimum for CE marks is not required to appear for End Semester Examination.
- 3. However, students are required to submit at least one assignment, and attend at least one test paper/practical/case analysis for each course, without which the results of the end semester shall be withheld.
- 4. Late fees shall be levied from students who submit the assignments after the due date. The late fee shall be fixed by the university from time to time.
- 5. There shall be no CE marks for project work/essay.
- 6. Students need not repeat the entire semester in case of failure in end semester examinations. They may re-appear for the failed courses in the next chance.

#### Code of conduct

- 1. The students who registered under SDE should strictly adhere to the rules and regulations framed by the university.
- 2. All students must:
  - a. Treat all employees(permanent or temporary) and other students with respect, dignity and courtesy.
  - b. Act ethically and honestly while attending contact classes, presenting seminars, assignments, other academic works and during examination.
  - c. Use university resources including libraries, laboratories and other resources in a lawful and ethical manner.
  - d. Refrain from using tobacco, liquor and other narcotic substances within the campus.
  - e. Refrain from littering the campus with plastic wastes.
  - f. Hold back from using cell-phones and other electronic gadgets during class hours, during examinations and office premises during working hours.
  - g. Refrain from participating in any kind of ragging and other anti-social activities.

Students involved in activities that are against institutional norms will be punished and expelled from the institutions.
